Idioter's Corner by Mich Ravera

I have heard it said that when something must be done come hell or high water, you can be sure that plenty of both are on order.

So, it is on our Board of Directors. Elsewhere in these pages, Ray has explained that three of our best Board members are not seeking to continue when their current terms expire in a couple months. We aren't looking to replace them. We are looking for people who want to do something for Bridge in the Silicon Valley.

If you care how your dues and sectional fees are spent, come join the Board!

If you care how the section is run, come join the Board!

If you want insight, come join the Board.

It's only one hour per month and a few extra hours per year. You probably spend more time than that waiting for your partner to show up at the game!

A Few (More) Simple Agreements by Mich Ravera

We have all done it! Your partner opens and your right hand opponent cue bids. You have a hand that isn't shapely enough to preempt, isn't strong enough to force game, and you really don't have a good enough fit to raise your partner to the 3-level with 3-card support and a balanced 8-count. But you don't really want to pass either. You aren't sure of either your opponents' agreements or of your own, so rather than ask for an explanation of the cue bid and try to reason out and invoke your own meta-agreements, you just make a **frustration double**.

Now, I will be the first person to admit a desire further to compete in an auction like this and anyone who has ever played within three tables of me has heard how difficult it would be for me to keep my hand out of the bidding box holding only a balanced 8-count after my partner has opened.

But, as I sort of intoned last month, wouldn't it be better to have an agreement?

I don't know anyone who actually plays this cue bid as showing a single suit (whether natural or artificial), but, if you ever ran into such an agreement, wouldn't you want to treat this in the very same way as if they had actually overcalled the suit that they are showing? Doesn't that leave you in the very familiar **negative double** and strong raise cue bid situation? If they are blatant enough to play it natural, aren't you effectively in the **takeout double** only with the secure knowledge that your partner probably has a balanced hand that isn't in your **1NT** range (either that or your opponent has momentarily lapsed into insanity or dementia)?

A few players play this cue bid as a strong 3-suited takeout. If opponents play this way, your life is simple: You can either raise (probably preemptively) or you can pass.

A lot of players play that, under some circumstances, this cue bid shows two known suits. It seems that you should probably agree that either a double here either shows values prepares a later penalty double or that it shows better length in the "free" suit but a tolerance for your partner's suit. With two known suits shown by opponents, you can play something analogous to "unusual over unusual" cue bidding either of the opponents' suits shows a good hand with the higher ranking of the opponents' suits showing the higher ranking suit not claimed by opponents and the lower ranking suit showing the lower ranking suit. This last agreement is.
















But, life isn't usually as simple as any of that. Most players under many circumstances play that the cue bid shows one known suit and one unknown suit ("Bailey", major suit "Michaels", etc). The shortcut to memory is simply to ignore the fact that your opponent has an unknown suit. Double should be **negative** and bidding your opponent's known suit should show an invitational or better raise for your partner. Jeff Hack has opined in these pages that "if you have one suit, they probably have the other." So, your bids of either of the two unknown suits that your right hand opponent may have should probably show some length in that suit. The suit may be breaking very badly, if you have to play in it. Maybe you would like to have a few cards in your partner's suit as a safety net.
