If you ask players with 40 masterpoints whether they play transfers, it usually means over no trump openers and often over 1NT overcalls. If you ask players with 4,000 masterpoints whether they play transfers, it often means something entirely different. Transfers are a useful concept that can be employed in a number of situations that have nothing whatever to do with no trump. The most important feature of transfers is not the hand that they hide, nor the hand that might get to declare, nor the hand that gets to play last on the opening lead. If these had been the only advantage of transfers, they would have been abandoned many years ago. The big advantage of transfers is that they give the transferring hand a chance to bid again. They make it possible for a bid that must be either forcing or non-forcing to be made in either situation. I will gladly say more, if anyone asks.

If you'd like to learn about transfer bidding, read on. Jeff Hack, who has written a number of columns that have appeared in our Unit's newsletter, and a player who evidently likes to complicate his life, asked to hear more about transfers. Suppose your partner opens a weak **2H**. Suppose further, as usual, you have a void in hearts, few high cards, but a 7-card club suit. If you were permitted to bid **3C** and then superglue your partner's bidding box shut, that would be exactly what you would do, but that would be illegal. Suppose, instead, you have a decent hand with pretty good clubs and heart support and would like to bid **3C** on the way to supporting hearts in hopes that you might uncover a

double fit in the round suits and may be on your way to game or slam. Or suppose that you have the C **AK** and a couple small hearts with very little else that will help. Wouldn't you like to be able to bid **3C** to direct a club lead for the likely situation where your side would end up on defense? Well, with transfers, you can do all of this. Of course, you'd make a transfer into clubs (most of us would use **2NT** as the transfer bid here). In the first case, after partner took the transfer, you would just pass. In the second case, you would rebid **3H** or **4H** at your next turn. In the last case, you would hope that opponents would get busy and bid their diamonds or spades, but bid **3H** or something else, if opponents didn't. If you already play transfers over no trump bids, all of this will be entirely familiar. It's just a different context. Maybe I'll say more in the new year.
